SQUASH & RACKETBALL

INFORMATION FOR MEMBERS

1. Ferriby Hall Squash and Racketball Club is available for the use of members seven days a week, fifty two weeks of the year.
2. The Club is a self service club, and does not employ staff on site. Access to the building is by using a fob which is provided when you join, which is also used to turn on the court lights. (The fobs belong to the club and should be returned when your membership ceases).
3. Courts can be booked from 8.00 am (courts 1 and 2) and 8.20 am (court 3) for 40 minute periods (the staggered time being to avoid congestion in the changing rooms). The last available court is at 10.00 pm (courts 1 and 2) and 9.40 pm (court 3). Players need to vacate the building by 11.00 pm and not enter before 7.00 am, as an alarm system will be activated, resulting in an expensive call out of the security firm. If you are the last one to leave, please ensure that all the lights are switched off, using the switches to the left of the entry door, and that the Velox roof windows are closed.
4. Court bookings can be peak or off-peak. Peak courts are from 4.00 pm (courts 1 and 2) and 4.20 pm (court 3) Monday to Friday, and cost £7.50, to be shared between the two players. Off peak courts (all other times and days) cost £6.
5. Courts can be booked online via the club website www.ferribysquash.org by members up to two weeks in advance, and there is no limit to the number of bookings any member can make. You can also book courts at the club by using your fob on the console which is situated at the end of the lower corridor.
6. Courts for pre-arranged events (eg Team Handicap Leagues, Individual Mini-leagues, coaching by qualified Coaches and matches against other clubs), are booked by the Committee in advance of two weeks.
7. Court bookings are for 40 minutes. However, if you are at the club and want to make use of an un booked court, you can do so by fobbing the lights for 10 minute periods. (This could also apply if you wish to carry on after the 40 minutes and the court following yours is not booked).
8. Court lighting is activated automatically at the start of the booked period, although the second player needs to use the fob on the button adjacent to the court to complete the process. The cost is deducted from your credit on your membership account. Court heating is activated by a switch adjacent to court 2 and can be On, Off or Automatic. Each court also has a ventilation system which is activated using the appropriate switch to the left of the entry door.
9. Playing guests are limited to four visits per year.
10. Non members can be coached by a qualified Coach for up to four sessions.
11. All players are expected to wear non-marking foot ware (changed from outdoor shoes) and appropriate clothing.
12. Please use the lockers to the left of the entrance lobby or the changing rooms to store bags, clothing etc., rather than in the corridor or on the gallery.
13. No drinks can be taken on court.

14. Should blood or any other body fluid (such as saliva or sweat) drip onto the court floor, it needs wiping up immediately to avoid marking the floor and to avoid injury through slipping. In the event of injury, there is a first aid box in the Club office adjacent to the door of court 1.
15. Squash and Racketball rackets, balls and other accessories can be borrowed from the Club office. New rackets and accessories such as eye protectors (compulsory wear for Juniors) can be viewed in the cabinet in the lower corridor, and purchased from the Club Coach, Andy Cockerill.
16. The squash club car park is the upper one accessed through the main entrance and driving past the two lower car parks and to the left of the squash club. Please do not use the two lower car parks, they belong to the occupiers of the main building, which is independent of the Squash Club building.

17. The Club Membership Year runs from 1 November, and every member wishing to renew their membership will be invited to do so before this date. There are several categories of membership, and the current rates are as follows –

Adult £130 (£65 for new members for the first year)

Adult Over 65 £115 (£65 for new members for the first year)

Full time students over 18 years old on 1 November £35

Juniors at secondary school on 1 November £20

Juniors at primary/junior school on 1 November £5

The rates are reduced by 25% for each completed quarter after 1 November. New members joining in October get that month free. Members who are parents can each join one junior member of the family free.

18. Members should make themselves conversant with the information on the Club website www.ferribysquash.org and on the Members noticeboard on the gallery above court 1. It is also worth reading the Head Guide to Squash, which is on the noticeboard in the lower corridor, particularly the section dealing with lets and strokes.
