Max Hall secures victory at BJC in thrilling BU9 finals

Max Hall of Yorkshire has emerged victorious at the 2024 ProAir British Junior Squash Championship in the Boys Under 9 category, cementing his place as a rising star in junior squash. The prestigious event, held from October 31 to November 3, saw Hall overcome a series of tough opponents to claim the gold medal in an intense and dramatic final.



The BU9 competition, structured into a group format, culminated in a high-stakes battle between the top two seeds, Max Hall (1) and Keaton Fiander-Derry (2) of Surrey. Fiander-Derry, known for his fast movement and powerful two-handed backhand, started strong, taking an early lead, winning the first game 11-6. Max Hall responded positively in the second game, winning 11-7 to level the match. Fiander-Derry then came back fiercely to claim the third game 11-6 and put himself one game away from victory.

However, Max Hall displayed remarkable resilience and strategic brilliance in the fourth game. His precise shots, tight drops, and intelligent use of space left Fiander-Derry scrambling, allowing Hall to dominate with an 11-4 win, levelling the match at two games apiece.



The fifth and final game was a nail-biting affair, with both players feeling the pressure of the occasion. Fiander-Derry started strong, but Hall refused to let him gain any significant advantage. Despite some unforced errors from both due to nerves, Hall maintained his composure, eventually securing the match 11-9 after four match points, claiming the gold medal and the prestigious title. Hall's journey to the top was marked by consistency and improvement.

In the opening match of the final group for positions 1-4, Hall had already defeated Cristian Law of Hertfordshire in a convincing 3-1 victory, reversing the outcome of their previous encounter four months earlier. This win showcased Hall's growth and preparation, as he made fewer errors and played with the consistency expected of a top seed.



In the final match against Eyad, who had exceeded expectations throughout the tournament, Hall once again proved his dominance. Despite some nerves, he secured a straightforward 3-0 victory, ensuring his unbeaten record in the group stage and crowning himself as the British Junior Champion for the first time.

Max Hall's triumph at the British Junior Squash Championship 2024 is a testament to his hard work, dedication, and talent. His ability to overcome strong opponents and handle pressure with poise suggests a bright future in the world of squash.
